He made particular mention of:

- The governance of Cricket Wellington and the new Board members subject to election to the Board.

President's Report

The 2009/2010 saw the club continue to maintain the progress it has made in the last few years, with playing numbers being maintained despite the competition from competing activities.

A new indoor practice facility at Onslow College, which was developed with assistance from the club and funding from the New Zealand Community Trust, will ensure that players in our catchment area have some of the best practice facilities available any where.

Unfortunately whilst having a better side on paper than previous seasons, the senior side didn't always play to their potential and finished third in the Hazlett competition. Perhaps in the coming season, the clubs 125th we can realise the potential that has been shown in recent seasons and win our way up to the Pearce Cup premier competition.

The second men's team playing in Senior 3 did well to finish third, giving that we had finished last the previous season. The Senior women's team and the Super 8's finished a credible second in their respective grades.

Once again congratulations to Luke Woodcock on his Firebird's performances, a Wellington record number of first class runs (988 runs at an average of 65.86 including a personal best of 220 not out) and selection in the New Zealand Emerging Players side. Luke also deservedly won the Wellington Cricketer of the year award, together with the Outstanding Batsman award and the fielding award. Thanks also for the continuing loyalty and support showed to the club.

Barry Rhodes had a great first season for the club getting selected in the Wellington Provincial A side and deservedly won the Hazlett Cricketer of the year award.

Congratulations also to Sian Ruck for her selection in the Wellington Blaze and the White Ferns side and the team that played in the recent T20 World Cup in the West Indies, finishing runners up to Australia. Congratulations also to Megan Wakefield, Michelle Bunkall for their selection in the Blaze team. Megan also deservedly won the Women's Club Cricketer of the year award. Well done to Caitlin Eves and Kim Will who won selection in the Wellington Development team.

Thanks again to Dave Edgecombe who continues to do an outstanding job leading and keeping the wheels of the club ticking over. Thanks also to Rick Mudgway who does a great job ensuring that we get our sides on the field and that they are as well prepared as possible. Rick was deservedly recognised by Cricket Wellington as the inaugural winner of the Mike Curtis Cup. Once again Gail Mudgway has done a great job controlling the finances and performing the secretarial tasks.

Thanks also to Faye Pulley for maintaining the web site. To all of the others who have helped from time to time, thanks very much.

As everyone is aware the coming season is the club's 125th, making it the second oldest cricket club in Wellington. A weekend of celebrations are planned for 4th, 5th and 6th of March 2011, so please be sure to register early as a big attendance, particularly of past players is expected.

Chairman's Report

The 2009-10 season was one to be remembered for individual efforts rather than team success. On the back of outstanding performances from standout players Luke Woodcock and South African import Barry Rhodes Johnsonville finished 3rd place in Hazlett Trophy, unfortunately this time not featuring in the final for what would have been the 3rd consecutive occasion. Although this was disappointment enough, a 14th out of 16 placing in the *Spirit of Cricket* points (awarded by umpires) highlighted what further development is necessary for this team if we are to ever achieve our primary goal as this becomes pretty tough if you're up against 13.

Johnsonville did start well enough though sharing the Twenty/20 spoils with Upper Hutt becoming joint winners of the Senior Twenty/20 Cup.

Congratulations to Luke Woodcock – surpassing 100 games for the club and accruing 4500 runs and he now has the Most Senior Centuries (8). Luke also had an excellent representative season for the Wellington Firebirds and was deservedly recognised with Men's Cricketer of the Year, Most Outstanding Batsman and Men's Outstanding Fielder awards for 2009-10.

He achieved a further representative honours with a recall for inclusion in the New Zealand A selection.

Barry Rhodes also achieved with both bat and ball during the season and was rewarded with the Hazlett Trophy Cricketer of the Year prize.

Barry, our second import in as many years to bolster our top team's chances proved his worth and deserved such recognition. He attracted a lot of support with a high demand for his coaching services from the junior section and also assisted with Newlands College teams.

I hope Barry continues on at the club as I am confident we have not yet seen the best of him in terms of match winning performances.

The senior women were strengthened by Megan Wakefield and Michelle Bunkall (ex Taita) and I had high hopes we could seriously challenge Onslow and take out the Senior Women's Championship. This failed to eventuate as the team composition again struggled significantly when Blaze commitments rendered some of the team unavailable. On a positive note though the Women were restored to a formidable unit and became again a strength of the club after a disappointing 2008-09 when even the likelihood of fielding a team for 2009-10 was in doubt for a while. The Senior Women finished third. Megan Wakefield took out the Women's' Club Cricketer of the Year award, with Michelle Bunkall not far behind in 4th place overall.

Represented at higher levels was Sian Ruck, selected for the White Ferns Twenty/20 World Cup campaign in the West Indies.

Sian was joined by both Megan and Michelle in the Wellington Blaze campaign. Megan's experience was called upon by making her the Blaze captain.

The Super 8's, with a regular pool of players enjoyed their style of cricket finishing a creditable second.

Senior 3's who found themselves in a little trouble languishing at the bottom of the table last season really turned the tables and threatened for top spot with only a couple of matches remaining.

I commend captain Kunal Kapadia for leading the challenge. Strategically, the senior status of this team must be maintained for player development. Consistent performances of merit should see reward with a Senior 1 team berth. I hope you continue on in the same fashion in 2010-11 and deliver such performances that present opportunities to further your cricket.

Other lower grade teams shared mixed success. In these grades club was represented by:

- 2B Bandits (4th)
- Youth Women (2nd)
- 1B Cripples (4th)
- 1B Deaf (Last)
- 1B Cougar Hunters (5th)
- Twenty/20 (Mid Table)

These teams all performed creditably, turned up with good numbers and represented the club with pride. Teams in the senior section of the club totalled 10 and all obliged when requested back at the clubrooms on social occasions. Prize giving was supported by all teams to an extent that a real "club" atmosphere, not seen for a while, emerged once again.

The off field club activity was again highlighted by a very successful "Past Players Day".



Our 125th Anniversary is planned for 4-6 March 2011 with a celebration weekend of events. Both the history of the club and its future will be pondered. The club will utilise this opportunity to assist going forward by launching the Johnsonville Cricket Foundation - a mechanism through which players and supporters alike can formally belong, contribute and guide the direction of the club. This is a chance for all to participate and forge together JCC's future as a stand-alone entity – I both welcome and encourage your support in this.

The Alex Moore Park Community & Sport Inc. Society has been established, a Board selected who are rapidly embarking upon furthering the combined clubrooms (& community facility) project.

Real progress will be seen over the next 18 months with finalisation of plans, estimated costing and sourcing of funds.

Financially the operational stability of the club has strengthened. Unlike last season where the subs take was down, 2009-10 was a significant improvement. Senior section subs exceeded that of the junior section for the first time I can remember and particularly heartening was the high percentage rate paid (97%).

However, Community Grants* were again the major contributing factor in enabling the club to pay its way as the subscription intake even though well supported falls well short of covering all the necessary costs. We still rely heavily upon these grants and must plan for the day when we are not so fortunate. I refer again to the inception of the Johnsonville Cricket Foundation, which can be one such means of assistance or certainly a back-up option in times of hardship.

Other means of meaningful income were Clubrooms Hire and the Junior Cricket Academy. With promise but mixed success the JC Café was trialed – but unfortunately no-one would take it on and run with it as hoped. Other fundraising initiatives must be explored – funding trusts like to support efforts that have already been made by potential recipients.

Working with the committee has been productive for the club and an enjoyable experience for me. I wish to thank those whose hard work in trying to make the cricketing experience of others as rewarding as possible:

- Club Captain Rick Mudgway whose invaluable contribution gives the club clear direction and ambition – tasks too many to mention. D deservedly recognised by Cricket Wellington this season as the inaugural recipient of the Mike Curtis Cup for *Volunteer Service to Club Cricket*.
- Secretary/Treasurer Gail Mudgway whose tight reign on the club funds and prudence has kept the entire operation in good stead for another season, specifically by providing accountability to the auditor and the funding trusts.
- Emmett Ward whose handyman skills maintained the clubrooms and helped keep us compliant. Unfortunately Emmett resigns from this role for the next season.
- Bill Taylor (Junior Convener) and the junior committee for their efforts and support
- Mike Lowe – for contributing with use of a car.
- Bobby Ewing – painting out graffiti, car patch ups, 125th Anniversary signs and general passion and enthusiasm for the club
- Mark Pulley, Megan Wakefield and Barry Rhodes for being supportive and instrumental with their coaching initiatives and assistance with the JCC Junior Winter Academy.
- Faye Pulley – for her contribution to women's cricket at the club and her role in updating the club website.

And Matt Hunter, Hamish Lang plus anyone else I've inadvertently omitted all of which have mucked in when called upon.

Of course Cheryl Styles (statistician & scorer), her efforts were again appreciated for yet another season – the club recognises your contribution and efforts not to mention your long-term loyalty.

Alan Isaac – it would be remiss of me not to acknowledge the contribution you have made not only to this club and Wellington Cricket, but as New Zealand Cricket Chairman, I wish you well in becoming the ICC Vice President and your Presidential term thereafter.

I look forward to the forthcoming season, both for the cricket on the park and the 125th celebrations becoming of a great club. 125 years is an achievement in itself. Some fond memories will be relived by past players and supporters as they should be, but lets also make it a season to remember with a little of the silverware that has alluded us in recent times. That would really be the icing on the anniversary cake!

Junior Section Report

The Johnsonville Junior Cricket Club registered 254 players (241 boys and 13 girls), 15 less than last season, which meant 3 fewer teams, a total of 24 plus a Nursery grade. Player numbers were very good in Under 8, Under 9, Under 10 and Under 11 and poor in Under 12, Under 14 and Girls Hardball. The season started 1 week late because of problems preparing grounds followed by rain early November but overall few Saturdays were lost.

The club received \$4,000 sponsorship from Hutt Mana Trust to assist teams to attend Hawke's Bay cricket camps and five teams attended, two Under 13, Under 11, Under 10 and Under 14 Girls.

One player was selected for the Under 13 team, two for the Under 12 and one for the Under 11 winter training squad.

The 2009 Premier team, coached by Kevin McAlister, finished second to Onslow, the 2009-10 Colts also finished second and the 2010 Premier team is currently lying first with half the competition complete.

The senior club signed up Barry Rhodes, the junior club assisted with some finance. Barry provided coaching for many junior players. Feedback from parents was extremely positive. This is the second season this support has been provided and there have been lots of interest in the private coaching.

During the 2010 winter the senior and junior clubs joined to run an academy for junior players and just over 40 have taken part using the Onslow College Farnboro Centre.

The junior club committee was Bill Taylor, Dave Edgecombe, Martin Glaeser, Kevin McAlister, Darrin Thomson and Athula Wanasinghe. After many years on the committee Martin Glaeser has moved on, his efforts as treasurer were appreciated.

Senior 1 (Hazlett Trophy)

The senior team was undefeated during the 20/20 campaign, which was a pleasing start to the season.

The senior squad was looking strong and had a lot of completion for places, with guys coming through putting pressure on some more established players in the Club. Mario Stols returned to the Club, as did Matthew Judge. There were a few milestones in the season including Matthew Judge and Luke Woodcock playing their 100th match for the Club and I hope many more to come.

The side was unlucky to miss out on the one day final however there was still a strong belief that the side could push on and make the three-day final at the end of the season. With the introduction of first innings points in the two-day matches, batting well was going to become even more important. Mark Pulley and Barry Rhodes led the way with the bat this season and it was pleasing to see guys stepping up when they had to. With Luke Woodcock at the top of the order our batting line-up looked the strongest I have seen since I have been involved at the Club.

Heading into the two day round we struggled to pick up first innings points which in the end probably cost us a chance to make the final. We lost a match vs. Collegians that was played on what could only be described as a shocking cricket wicket by two runs and then with a few weeks washed out we were mid table coming into Christmas. We picked up points after Christmas and going into the final game we still had an outside chance to finish high enough to qualify for the final. It was not to be and we ended up finishing 3rd.

Sam Outtrim bowled superbly during the season to be our leading wicket taker and with Barry Rhodes, Ryan Issac , Gareth Powell and Mario Stols we had a formidable bowling attack. Also pleasing to see some youngsters coming through, with David Hudson we have a very promising fast bowler.

Against Karori in early February Sam Outtrim and myself set a club record 8th wicket partnership of 125 which was very pleasing for the both of us and something that hopefully in the forthcoming season we see happen a lot more.

Finally I would just like to thank everyone involved with the side for all the help that goes into running the team. Rick Mudgway for his superb management skills, we are very lucky as a side that we have him to run around and organise everything for us. Also Cheryl Styles for her scoring and stats updates. This is the sort of thing that deters young players from playing.

The standard of pitches during the season was very good with the obvious tracks being belters like Alex Moore, Petone Rec and Vic Uni.

Overall the season was good, there was some superb cricket played and the inclusion of T/20 cricket was a welcomed inclusion. Would like to see what the new season will bring. Hopefully with some changes (umpiring, scheduling, overhauled reporting and stats system etc)

1 REPORTING ENTITY

These financial statements have been prepared for JOHNSONVILLE CRICKET CLUB INCORPORATED which is an incorporated society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908, and a reporting entity for the purposes of the Financial Reporting Act 1993. These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Act 1993.

2 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Measurement base

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position of the Club on a historical cost basis are followed by the Club. Accrual accounting is used to recognise expenses and revenues when they occur.

Specific accounting policies

The following specific accounting policies which materially effect the measurement of the financial performance and financial position have been applied.

GST due or recoverable at balance date is included in either current liabilities or current assets.

Differential reporting

The entity qualifies for differential reporting as it is not publicly accountable and it meets the size criteria. The Club has taken full advantage of all available differential reporting exemptions.


Other than in my capacity as auditor, I am a playing member of this Club. I have no other relationship with or interest in the Club.
